Crawl to Southern Prince George and Anne Arundel Counties, Maryland [Thanks to Bob Hobbs for Arranging this Day!]

9:00 AM St. Paul's Moravian Church

8505 Heathermore Boulevard, Upper Marlboro, MD

We will see and play the Hook and Hastings Opus 702 of 1873 with two manuals and pedal and ten ranks. The organ was originally in the First Rising Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Washington, DC. The instrument was restored by David Storey and placed in St. Paul's in the early 1990s.

Directions to St. Paul's:

From the Capital Beltway take Exit 11, Md Rte. 4 (Pennsylvania Ave.) South-East to its intersection with US Route 301 (Crain Highway). Turn right (south) onto US 301 and proceed about 4-1/2 miles to Heathermore Blvd. (at a traffic light). Turn left onto Heathermore and at the top of the hill turn right onto Trumps Hill Rd. After a very short distance turn left onto Monmouth and the parking lot for St. Paul's.

10:45 AM *Trinity Episcopal Church*14515 Church St., Upper Marlboro, MD

We will see and hear the 1909 Steer and Turner Organ with two manuals and pedal and 11 ranks with a tubular-pneumatic pedal system. The organ was installed in Trinity Church by our member Jim Baird.

Directions to Trinity:

Return to US 301 via Heathermore and bear right onto US 301. After a distance of a little over one mile, turn left onto Old Crain Highway and continue to Church Street, Upper Marlboro. Bear right onto Church Street and Trinity Episcopal will be on the right.

12:30 PM Friendship United Methodist Church 27 West Friendship Road, Friendship, Maryland

We will have lunch, our annual business meeting, and then see and play the 2006 Oberlinger Tracker organ with two manuals and pedal and 15 ranks and 15 stops. Lunch will be available for a donation of \$10.00 (larger donations which will go to the organ fund will, of course, be accepted.)

Directions to Friendship Methodist:

Continue on Church Street the same way that you were going. Church Street ends at Water Street. Turn right onto Water Street. Go a short distance to an underpass, and immediately after going under the underpass, turn left onto the ramp to Md Rte. 4. Proceed 4.5 miles on Rte. 4 to a ramp on the right to Rte. 258 East. Travel about 4.3 miles east on Rte. 258 to a traffic light at the intersection to Md Rte. 2. Turn right onto Rte. 2. After about 3.5 miles, turn left onto Md Rte. 778, Old Solomons Island Road. (A caution: along Rte. 2, there are other roads labelled "Old Solomons Island Road"—Turn left **only** onto Rte. 778.) At the intersection with Rte. 261 turn right. Friendship Church is on the right, with parking, just beyond the intersection.

HILBUS CHAPTER APRIL CRAWL – SUBURBAN MARYLAND

A report by Peter Crisafulli

St. Rose of Lima Chapel

Saturday, April 28 began cool, clear and sunny – a great day for an organ crawl!

We started out at the chapel of **St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church**, 11701 Clopper Road, Gaithersburg, MD, home to a 3 ½ stop Bedient *Boston Model* with pull-down pedal. The acoustics in the chapel are quite good, and this charming little instrument filled the room effortlessly, even just the 8' & 4'.

The half-stop Sesquialtera starts at middle c and provides a piquant solo color in the right hand – an unexpected sonority from such a small instrument. The 8' Gedackt is divided between bass and treble allowing the player to use all stops in the right hand (solo), accompanied by the left hand 4' and 2' played an octave lower (thus sounding as if 8' and 4'). The instrument occupies a small foot print on the right side of the chapel in front of the congregation and is pleasing to look at with its oak case of simple elegance and façade pipes with gold-leafed upper lips. This instrument sounds as good as it looks!

The manual compass is $C-g^3$ (56 notes), and the pull-down flat pedal board is $C-f^1$ (30 notes). The stops are:

- 8' Gedackt (divided draw at middle c, wood and metal pipes)
- 4' Rohrfloete
- 2' Prestant (façade)
- II Sesquialtera (treble)

Next, we visited **Messiah Lutheran Church**, 13901 Clopper Road, Germantown, MD. Here, the organ is a versatile 2 manual and pedal 30 rank, 23 stop Flentrop built in 1990. It stands magnificently in the choir loft at the rear of the worship space looking "very Dutch." Most of the façade pipes are speaking except for an upper flat standing in front of the swell box located above the Hoofdwerk. The 5 Pedaal stops stand behind the manual divisions in a connected case and speak through the Hoofdwerk. Unfortunately, there is too much sound-absorbent material in the modern, but pleasant, worship space. However, the organ sounded well in spite of this. The principal choruses are bright and clear without being over-bearing, the flutes varied and colorful, the reeds blend beautifully as well as functioning effectively in solo capacity, and there are many colorful mutations. The 8' Gamba and 4' Prestant on the Swell sound like a miniature string chorus from a different era – not what one would expect on this instrument! For its modest size, this instrument is large in color, variety, and builds up smoothly from *piano* to *forte*.

Pedal keys: oak. Case: French oak.

Action: mechanical throughout. Rollers and trackers: red cedar

Rollerboards: oak.

Wind supply: one large reservoir.

Wind trunks: oak. Pressure: 58mm.

Pipework: all pipes 30% tin, 70% lead, with the exception of the Pedaal

Subbas 16 & Fluit 8 which are mahogany.

Following lunch, our final stop was at **Damascus United Methodist Church**, 9700 New Church Road, Damascus, MD. Here the organ is unlike anything we had seen and heard earlier in the day, for this church houses a fine 3 manual and pedal Skinner organ, Opus 843, built in 1930. It is characterized by lushness and opulence without being heavy, flabby, wooly or dull. The plenum exhibits an elegant, restrained brilliance, and there is refinement and polish in every stop. Dynamics range from triple piano to fortissimo and can be controlled effortlessly. The organ speaks unimpeded into the room from a large chamber on the left side of the chancel with the unenclosed Great and Pedal closest to the congregation. There are no façade pipes.
