#### FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

#### **Directions:**

From Washington, D.C. Take I-66 W and travel some 50 miles (depending on where you join I-66); Merge onto US-17 N via Exit 23 toward Deleplane/Paris, 8 miles; Turn left onto John S. Mosby Highway/US-50W/US-17N and follow 18 miles; Turn right onto S. Cameron St/US-50W/US-11N/US-522N for a mile. You will arrive at 116 South Loudoun Street.

From Baltimore, MD. Take 1-70 W towards Frederick about 40 miles; Merge onto US-340W via Exit 52 toward Charles Town/Leesburg (passing into Virginia and West Virginia) about 18 miles. US-340W becomes William L. Wilson Freeway, 4 miles; William L. Wilson Freeway becomes US-340, 3 miles; Merge onto US-340S toward Berryville/Leesburg (crossing into VA) 13 miles; Merge onto VA-7W toward Winchester, 10 miles; Turn left onto N. Pleasant Valley Road, half mile; Take third right onto E. Cork Street, less than a mile; arrive at 116. South Loudoun Street.

#### E. POWER BIGGS FELLOWSHIP

The E. Power Biggs Fellowship of the Organ Historical Society is awarded to outstanding applicants with a developing interest in the American pipe organ. The intent of the Fellowship is to introduce people to the historic pipe organ through conventions of the Organ Historical Society.

The award provides financial support for attending a convention, covering registration, travel within the continental U.S., and lodging and meals during the convention. Some expenses, such as registration and lodging, are paid directly by the Society; others, notably travel to the convention city, are reimbursed after the convention.

The OHS welcomes and encourages applications from performers, builders, organ enthusiasts, clergy, educators, composers, and virtually anyone who expresses and demonstrates an interest in the historic pipe organ in the United States. There is no age restriction, but preference will to given to applicants between the ages of 18 and 24, to full-time undergraduate and graduate students, and to applicants who have never attended an OHS convention. Financial need will also be considered. Previous Biggs Fellows are ineligible for further awards.

For the 2012 Chicago OHS Convention the Hilbus Chapter donated \$1,000.00 toward the E. Power Biggs Fellowship and this paid for one of the seven selected through the application process. The Hilbus Chapter was the only chapter that donated money to this wonderful award. At our membership meeting in June we voted 100 percent in favor of continuing this donation to the E. Power Biggs Fellowship. We are suggesting that each member contribute \$10.00 or more in addition to your \$14.00 dues which are due in October. It would be wonderful to send another young man or woman to the 2013 Vermont Convention.

### ANNAPOLIS AREA ORGAN CRAWL

SATURDAY, AUGUST 25, 2012 Reviewed By Gordon L. Biscomb

On Saturday, 25 August 2012, approximately twelve members of the Hilbus Chapter of the Organ Historical Society met to see, hear, and play music of their choice on two pipe organs in area in or near Annapolis.

Our first stop was at the Church of St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church in Severna Park where a 1984 Wicks Pipe Organ, Opus 5990 with two manuals and pedal and twenty four ranks of pipes.

On entering the red brick cruciform building, your attention is drawn to the brightly lighted area of the crossing with the altar beyond. To either side of the altar are three grouping of facade pipes made of flame burnished copper. The console is to the left of the sanctuary in the north transept and faces the back altar wall. it is a detached, drawknob console built to AGO specifications with a manual compass of CC to C4 (61 notes) and a pedal compass of CCC to G (32 notes). The organ is adequate to the pace and was ably demonstrated. The following is the organ specification.




After lunch at Bill Bateman's, just up the street on Ritchie Highway, we drove into Annapolis to visit St. Anne's Episcopal Church which sits in the center of the traffic circle (Church Circle) on Rowe Blvd. The organ is a 1975 Frieberger Orgelbau with thee manuals and pedal and has 49 ranks. The drawknobs are identified by a number and pipe designation. The organ is installed in a gallery above the main entrance with the pipes and chest for the positiv division installed on the gallery railing. The unnumbered drawknobs were added in 1992. The following is the specification:
