Kensington Maryland Area Churches Organized by Gerald Piercey

Members gathered at 10:00 a.m. at Hughes United Methodist Church in Wheaton, Maryland, where they enjoyed exploring and discovering the 3 manuals, 47 ranks, Lewis & Hitchcock Organ in the sanctuary. Originally installed in 1964/65 by the Newcomer Organ Company at 3 manuals and pedal, and 34 ranks. Möller built the console for this instrument. The Swell and Great chests were from the Skinner Pipe Organ from First Unitarian Church in Washington, D.C. The Choir chest was from a Hutchins Organ located in Huntington, West Virginia. The Antiphonal chest was from the Chapel of a school in Forest Glen, Maryland.

In 2002 the pipe organ was rebuilt by Lewis & Hitchcock. Included were new blowers for the main organ and the antiphonal organ, rebuilding of the console, and placing it on a new platform. In addition 13 new ranks of pipe work were added. During this time the chancel was rebuilt and the carpet removed.

Following lunch at the China Gourmet in Kensington members visited Cedar Lane Unitarian Church in Bethesda, Maryland home to a large Cannarsa Organ from 1987 consisting of 4 manuals and pedal, and 51 ranks.

Some background from the church website: In March of 1985, a contract was signed with Cannarsa Organs of Duncansville, Pennsylvania for the construction of a 51 rank four manual and pedal pipe organ. At that time the largest instrument in Montgomery County. The installation was completed in the fall of 1987, and was celebrated by a year-long festival which included special services and an organ recital series.

In December of 2000, an overwhelming successful campaign was launched to fund an extensive renovation of the organ. Improvements included refurbishment of the console and a complete update of the keying system which provided for an expanded stop list and MIDI capability, as well as the addition of a number of new digital voices from the Walker Technical Company. More digital voices were added in 2007.
