***Casavant Frères Ltée, Opus 1595, 1938 (rebuilt 2003 by Casavant)
3 manual and pedal - 33 ranks***

DIRECTIONS: From I-95 North toward Baltimore take the I-395 North Exit, **Exit 53**, toward Downtown/Inner Harbor. Keep right to take Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. toward Lee Street/Russell Street. Turn slight left onto N. Howard Street. Turn right onto W. 28th Street. Turn left onto North Charles Street/MD-139. The church is on the right. Parking is available at fenced-in-lot prior to reaching the church building. Parking is also available in front of the church and rectory.

DIRECTIONS: Start out going north on N. Charles Street to E. Eager Street. Take the third right onto E. Biddle Street. (Sammy's Trattoria is on the corner.) Turn left onto N. Calvert Street/MD-2. Continue to follow N. Calvert Street. Turn left onto E. 20th Street. Take the 1st left onto St. Paul Street/MD-139. (St. Michael and All Angels is on the corner.) St. Mark's is on the right. Before you reach St. Mark's there is a fenced parking lot. Turn right onto 19th Street to access the entrance to the lot. Parking is also available on 19th Street next to the church building.

Churches associated with George Washington, Saturday, August 27, 2017

Organized by Glen Frank and Ted Gustin

Members gathered at Christ Church Episcopal in Old Town Alexandria, Virginia to visit this historic church and its 1975 Austin. Former Organist-Choirmaster, Ted Gustin, gave brief remarks regarding the history of the church and the organ which was installed during his tenure.

The first organ in Christ Church was built by Jacob Hilbus in 1811. This instrument was one manual with no pedal and was in use in the church until at least 1840. At that time the Vestry announced plans to purchase a new organ from the proceeds of the sale of the Hilbus. It was moved to Trinity Episcopal Church in Shepherdstown, WV and later in 1865 to St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Hancock, Maryland. The St. Thomas vestry presented the Hilbus organ to the Smithsonian Institute in 1903. After restoration by the C.B. Fisk Organ Company it was placed on display in the Smithsonian Museum of History and Technology.

The current Austin instrument was built in 1975 and consists of three manuals and pedal with 35 ranks.

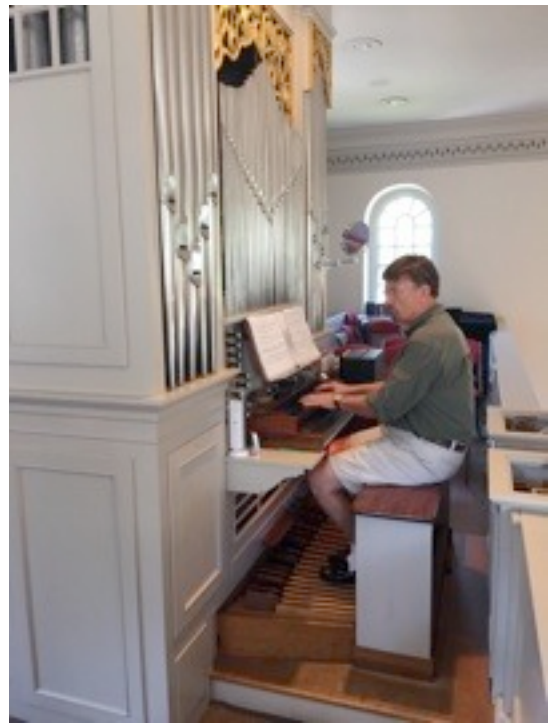
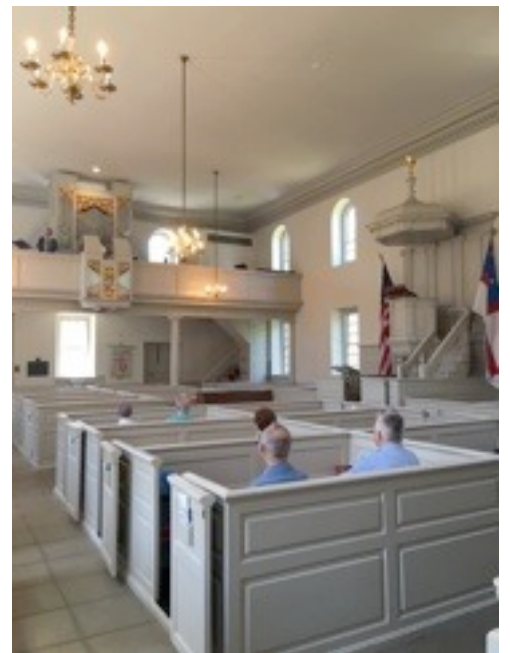
