Directions from the Capital Beltway I-495: Take Exit 33 – MD 185 Connecticut Ave. South. Drive about two miles and turn right onto Bradley Boulevard. Continue on Bradley to the traffic light at Wisconsin Ave. Turn right onto Wisconsin, and then another right into the parking lot adjacent to the north side of the church. Park in spaces designated for St. John's Church. Do NOT park in spaces designated for neighboring businesses and risk being towed! From the parking lot enter the church building using the side glass door by the chapel.

**THE NOVEMBER 2018 CRAWL** took members to three churches along Ft. Hunt Road in Alexandria, Virginia. Thanks to Gerald Piercey for organizing this event.

The first stop was Heritage Presbyterian Church: 8503 Fort Hunt Rd. Alexandria, VA 22308. The intimate modern church is home to Lewis & Hitchock, Inc. Opus 272 installed in 1994. The organ was designed by Gerald Piercey. The installation is in an angle behind the choir seating area and had to allow for a structural beam that curves up through the Swell enclosure. The Great and Pedal Bourdon is arranged, divided, on both sides of the Swell. The bottom 12 notes of the Great Principal, made of copper, forms a façade in front of that division. The organ has a very pleasing sound in the acoustically dead room. At the time the organ was being built Charles McManis conducted a voicing workshop for company staff and participated in some of the voicing and regulation of this instrument. The unification scheme provides great versatility for playing organ literature within the limits of a small number of ranks.



Our second stop was at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, 8900 Fort Hunt Rd. Alexandria, VA 22308. The church sanctuary is a tall brick walled room with a live and very "hot" acoustical ambience. The sound of the organ is characterized by clear, bright, exquisitely finished flue ranks and aggressive, pungent. Germanic reeds. One useful feature is the coupler manual. This is more useful than it might seem and allows for great flexibility not afforded by a manual coupler alone.



After a delicious lunch at the River Bend Bistro, we moved to Aldersgate United Methodist Church, 1301 Collingwood Rd. Alexandria, VA 22308. The Casavant organ at Aldersgate is divided at the front of the sanctuary behind the choir. The overall design of the building is similar to St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Kensington. The roof is steeply pitched above the pews and this provides some acoustic ambience in the well padded and carpeted space. The organ has a robust, full sound in the room of the Anglo-French sort that typifies the best work of the firm. The organist of the church and our host, Elizabeth Miller, demonstrated the organ beautifully for us in a short program.
